This document describes our privacy policy and use of cookies in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and applicable data protection regulations.

1. What are Cookies

Cookies are small text files that sites visited by the user send to the device (usually to the browser), they are stored in the corresponding folder of the browser while the user is intent on visiting a website, and then transmitted back to the same sites on subsequent visits.

They are used for the purpose of improving navigation, (the http protocol is stateless and cannot 'remember' the authenticated user browsing pages), saving user preferences already entered (username, password etc.). Some cookies, not those used on this site, allow tracking of the user's tastes and preferences so that we can manage the presence or absence of targeted marketing initiatives or the provision of services such as newsletters, dem etc..

If restrictions are placed on their use, this may affect the user's status during consultation. Blocking or removing them from the browser cache could cause an incomplete use of the services offered by the web application.

2. Types of Cookies

Session cookies are temporary cookies, which only exist for the duration of the user's session.

When the browser is closed, Session Cookies expire. These are typically used to identify users when they access a site, to remind the user of their preferences as they move between site pages, to provide them with specific information previously collected.

Persistent cookies remain active after the browser is closed and help sites remember user data and settings for later reference. This allows for faster and more time-efficient access, since there is no need to log in again. In addition to authentication, other website functionalities are made possible and include language selection, theme selection, menu preferences, bookmarks or favourites, and many others. During the visit the user selects their preferences and these will be remembered through the use of the persistent cookie during the next visit.

3. Essential cookies

Our site only uses essential cookies, i.e. those cookies necessary for the proper functioning of the platform. These cookies cannot be disabled as they are essential to ensure the security, accessibility and basic functionality of the site.

The essential cookies used may include, but are not limited to:

- Session cookies to keep the user logged in while browsing.
- Cookies for managing language preferences or accessibility settings.
- Cookies for security and protection against fraudulent activity.

These cookies do not collect personal information and are not used for marketing or profiling purposes.

4. Cookie privacy and security

Cookies are not viruses, they are just text files that are neither interpreted by the browser nor executed in memory. Consequently, they cannot duplicate themselves, spread to other networks to be replicated again. Since they cannot perform these functions, they do not fall under the standard definition of a virus.

Cookies, however, could be used for malicious purposes. Because they are used to store information about a user's preferences, history of actions, specific navigation between multiple sites, Cookies could be used to act as a form of spyware. Cookies generated by this site cannot be used for these purposes.

5. Other cookie-based threats

Since cookies are transmitted between the browser and the website, a malicious user or an unauthorised person could intercept the data transmission and the information related to it. Although relatively rare, this can happen if the browser connects to the site using an unprotected WI-FI network, for example. Other cookie-based attacks involve server settings. If a website does not require the browser to use only encrypted connections (e.g. https), attackers could exploit this vulnerability to trick visitors into sending personal information through insecure channels. Attackers could then hijack personal data for unauthorised processing purposes.
